Day 1 / Madrid

Meet and greet upon arrival and transfer to your Hotel. Check into the hotel. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 2 / Madrid

Breakfast at the Hotel. Today you can go on a Hop on Hop Off Tour of Madrid. Take a seat on an open-top double-decker bus sightseeing tour of Madrid that lets you create your own itinerary. This hop-on hop-off Madrid bus tour offers multiple stops along two routes that interconnect around the city — your ticket is valid on both. Remain on the bus for each loop while you listen to onboard commentary via an audio headset, or hop on and off at any stop to explore city sights on your own (admission fees are not included). Follow Route 1 (Blue Route) to view the Belle Epoque buildings of historical Madrid. Disembark to explore the Royal Palace, Almudena Cathedral, and the Prado Museum, or admire Gran Vía, Madrid's main



thoroughfare. Switch to Route 2 (Green Route) to focus on 19th- and 20th-century Madrid. Travel past skyscrapers and the legendary Bernabéu stadium—home to Real Madrid FC—along the Paseo de la Castellana. Perhaps stroll through the elegant bourgeois enclave of Salamanca, or visit the city's many museums with a focus on archaeology, sculpture, natural science and more. In the evening return to your hotel. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 3 / Madrid – Seville

Breakfast at the hotel, Departure transfer to train station to connect your High Speed AVE train to Seville. (Standard Class Train Ticket Included). Arrival transfer to your Hotel. Check into the Hotel. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 4 / Seville – Granada – Seville

Breakfast at the Hotel. You will be picked up at around 0615 hrs for this Full-day Granada, Alhambra Palace, and Albaicin tour from Seville. Enjoy priority access with skip-the-line tickets to the Alhambra Palace (Admission Included). Explore the UNESCO-listed Alhambra Palace and Nasrid Palace on a guided walking tour. Discover the hidden Nasrid palaces of the Albaicin quarter on an optional walking tour. The Alhambra is a palace and fortress complex located in Granada, Andalusia, Spain. It was originally constructed as a small fortress in AD 889 on the remains of Roman fortifications, and then largely ignored until its ruins were renovated and rebuilt in the mid-13th century by the Nasrid emir Mohammed ben Al-Ahmar of the Emirate of Granada, who built its current palace and walls. It was converted into a royal palace in 1333 by Yusuf I, Sultan of Granada. The Palace of Charles V (Admission Included) is a Renaissance building in Granada, southern Spain, located on the top of the hill of the Assabica, inside the Nasrid fortification of the Alhambra. The building has never been a home to a monarch and stood roofless until 1957. The structure was commanded by Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor, who wished to establish his residence close to the Alhambra palaces. Although the Catholic Monarchs had already altered some rooms of the Alhambra after the conquest of the city in 1492, Charles V intended to construct a permanent residence befitting an emperor. The project was given to Pedro Machuca, an architect whose biography and influences are poorly understood. At the time, Spanish architecture was immersed in the Plateresque style, still with traces of Gothic origin. Machuca built a palace corresponding stylistically to Mannerism, a mode still in its infancy in Italy. The exterior of the building uses a typical Renaissance combination of rustication on the lower level and ashlar on the upper. Even if accounts that place Machuca in the atelier of Michelangelo are accepted, at the time of the construction of the palace in 1527, the latter had yet to design the majority of his architectural works. The Palacio de Generalife (Admission Included) was the summer palace and country estate of the Nasrid rulers of the Emirate of Granada in Al-Andalus, now beside the city of Granada in the autonomous community of Andalusia, Spain. The Alcazaba (Admission Included) was a building used for military purposes. The first Arab constructions date back to the Caliphate period, possibly built over some ruins of a Roman fortress. In the 11th century, the "ziríes" expanded the enclosure, when Granada was the capital city of one of the "Taifas" kingdoms. Even so, the main constructions date from the "nazaríes" period (13th to 15th centuries). At this enclosure there are also some Christian additions like the round "Cubo" Tower. The Albaicín (Admission is Free) as it was known under Muslim rule, is a district of Granada, in the autonomous community of Andalusia, Spain. It retains the narrow winding streets of its Mediaeval Moorish past dating back to the Nasrid Kingdom of Granada. It was declared a World Heritage Site in 1984, along with the Alhambra. In the evening return back to Seville. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 5 / Seville – Cordoba – Seville

Breakfast at the Hotel. Enjoy a Full Day Tour of Cordoba. You will be picked up from your hotel in the morning around 0800 hrs, Relax during the 1.5-hour journey to Cordoba. Get acquainted with the history and cultural mélange of the fascinating city as your guide offers an introductory narration throughout the journey. On arrival, immediately notice the charismatic mix of Muslim, Christian and Jewish architecture and disembark to explore the historical heart of the city on foot. Weave your



way down Cordoba's quaint cobbled lanes and observe the abundance of flowering balcony boxes, antique bodegas and bespoke craft boutiques. Hear of the UNESCO World Heritage-listed city's prosperous past. We will visit Mezquita Catedral de Córdoba (Admission Included). Enter Cordoba's most important monument, the Mezquita (aka the Mosque-Cathedral of Córdoba), a symbol of the many religious changes the city has undergone over the centuries. Originally a Catholic church, it was converted into an Islamic mosque in the Middle Ages, then back into a church after the Reconquista. With its otherworldly architecture, the Mezquita is considered one of the most accomplished Moorish monuments in the world. Notice the mix of stately Roman columns, Baroque and Renaissance frescoes and Moorish tiles and arches as you stroll the interior. whose streets stretch out like capillaries and emerge onto tucked-away courtyards buzzing with locals enjoying post-siesta tapas. Next, head over to the old Jewish quarter (Juderia), whose streets stretch out like capillaries and emerge onto tucked-away courtyards buzzing with locals enjoying post-siesta tapas. Listen as your guide points out the distinctly Moorish flair to these mediaeval alleys, reminiscent of the Jews' prosperity under the Caliphate of Cordoba. Here you'll visit the Cordoba Synagogue, (Admission Included) one of the few synagogues existing today in Spain, built in 1315 in Mudéjar style. Before leaving Cordoba, walk down the tiny Calleja de las Flores alleyway, one of the most popular streets in the city. Look back to see Mezquita's tower peaking between the corridor. The Calleja de las Flores is one of the most popular and tourist streets of the city of Córdoba. It is a narrow passageway with arches and stones that is finished in a square where the visitor finds a series of flowerpots with geranium and carnations. Then enjoy your 1.5hours drive back to Seville. Return to your hotel. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 6 / Seville – Barcelona

Breakfast at the Hotel. Today morning you will proceed for a Seville Hop on Hop Off Bus Tour at any of the 12 stops around Seville. Then, simply watch the sights roll by, accompanied by the on-board audio commentary, available in 15 languages. Remain aboard for the 1-hour full loop, or hop on and off as you wish to explore on foot. Why not hop off near Seville Cathedral to admire this incredible church, one of the world's largest Gothic cathedrals? Or perhaps visit the stunning Plaza de España, built for the 1929 Ibero-American Exposition world fair, and set in glorious Maria Luisa Park. Alternatively, hop off to admire the 13th-century Tower of Gold beside the Guadalquivir River; visit the Archaeological Museum at the Plaza de América, or to ride the coasters at the Isla Mágica theme park. Your ticket also includes free entry to several Seville attractions among others, enjoy complimentary admission to the Castle of St George Inquisition Museum, once the seat of the Spanish Inquisition; and join a free walking tour to take in attractions such as Seville Cathedral and the markets and lanes of the historical Macarena quarter. In the afternoon. departure transfer to Seville train station to connect the High Speed AVE train to Barcelona.(Standard Train Travel Included). Arrive and transfer to your Hotel. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 7 / Barcelona

Breakfast at the Hotel. Make your own way to the start point for the tour. Explore Barcelona Hop-On Hop-Off Bus Tour. Simply hop aboard the open-top, double-decker bus and set off to explore the ancient, mediaeval and modern sights of beautiful Barcelona. Sit back into your comfortable seat and informative onboard audio commentary as you weave your way through Barcelona's elegant avenues, pretty squares, mediaeval lanes and palm-lined waterfronts. Switch between the different bus routes as you wish to explore different areas and aspects of the city, or stay aboard for the full loop to gain an overview of the city's sights and landmarks. When you're ready, hop off at any of the conveniently located stops and explore the attractions on foot, at your leisure. Perhaps meander around the mediaeval alleys of the Gothic Quarter; stop off to visit the extraordinary UNESCO-World Heritage-listed La Sagrada Familia church designed by the late, great architect Antoni Gaudí; or soak up the lively atmosphere, shops and street theatre along the vibrant Las Ramblas. Alternatively, hop off to visit some of Barcelona's cultural hotspots or to take a stroll around Port Olímpic, the picturesque palm-dotted marina crowned by a giant copper fish sculpture by Frank Gehry. These are just a sprinkling of the many things you can see and do during your hop-off hop-on tour! Buses depart from each stop regularly throughout the day. Overnight at the Hotel.



Day 8 / Barcelona - Zurich

Breakfast at the Hotel. Day free at leisure until departure transfer to Barcelona Airport. You will take your flight to Zurich. (Economy Class Ticket Included). Meet and Greet upon arrival at Zurich Airport and transfer to your hotel. Rest of the day free at leisure. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 9 / Zurich – Mt Titlis – Lucerne - Zurich

Breakfast at the Hotel, Today proceed for your Mt Titlis Tour. Depart from a central Zurich location in a comfortable, climate-controlled coach and relish scenic Swiss vistas as you travel along the shores of Lake Lucerne to the city of Lucerne. On arrival, enjoy some time at leisure and see popular landmarks like the Lion Monument, Rathaus (Town Hall) and Kapellbrücke (Chapel Bridge). Continue by coach to Engelberg, a mountain resort cradled by the Swiss Alps. Climb aboard a Rotair, a rotating cable car that affords panoramic Alpine vistas, and ascends to a dizzying height of 10,623 feet (3, 238 metres). Take in 360-degree views and then disembark at Mt. Titlis' snowy summit. Enjoy some free time to visit the magical Ice Palace and ride the Ice Flyer, if the weather allows, in order to get closer to frozen crevices. Soar down a snow slide in Glacier Park and summon your courage to walk over Europe's highest suspension bridge, the Titlis Cliff Walk. Warm up with a steaming beverage (own expense) and then reconvene with your guide for the return journey to central Zurich. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 10 / Zurich - Jungfrauoch – Top of Europe - Zurich

Breakfast at the Hotel. Start your Full Day Jungfrauoch Tour from the bus terminal in central Zurich and depart by coach for the scenic journey south. Travel among the towering peaks of Switzerland's Bernese Oberland to Lauterbrunnen, where a cogwheel train carries you up to Europe's highest-altitude train station, situated in a UNESCO-listed Alpine wilderness. The 50-minute train ride winds through the Kleine Scheidegg mountain pass in the Bernese Alps. Upon arrival at Jungfrauoch, situated at an elevation of 11,333 feet, disembark at the Top of Europe and head to the Alpine Sensation—a round-tour subway opened to mark the centenary of the Jungfrau Railway. Head to the Ice Palace for a glacier walk and stop at the Sphinx Observatory for sweeping views of Europe's longest glacier: Aletsch Glacier. From viewing platforms, enjoy a 360-degree panorama of this winter wonderland draped in a breathtaking display of ice and snow. On a clear day, look beyond to the mountain peaks of neighbouring Italy and France. If you wish, purchase a snack or warm drink at the on-site restaurant (at your own expense) before the return cogwheel train ride down to Lauterbrunnen, where your coach awaits. Relax on the drive back to Zurich, arriving at the bus terminal in the evening. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 11 / Zurich - Paris

Breakfast at the Hotel. Morning free to explore Zurich on your own. At 1230 hrs departure transfer to Zurich Train Station for your train to Paris. (Standard Class Ticket Included). Arrive in Paris and meet your driver at the station who will transfer you to the hotel. Rest of the day free at leisure to explore Paris . Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 12 / Paris (Hop on Hop Off with Eiffel Tower Level 2 and Cruise on Seine)

Breakfast at the Hotel. Explore your One day Hop-On Hop-Off bus ticket. Our first stop will be Eiffel Tower where we have to skip the line ticket to the 2nd floor. (Entrance Included). Then our next stop will be Champs-Elysees - The most beautiful avenue full with many shops and Arc de Triomphe. Next pass through the Musee d'Orsay- You can see the paintings of impressionist artists. Then next stop Arc de Triomphe. Arc de Triomphe is a monument commissioned by Napoleon for his glorious army when he returned covered in glory from the Austerlitz Battle. If you wish you can next visit Louvre Museum -



Louvre is the house of Mona Lisa. (Admission not included). Next is Cathedrale Notre-Dame de Paris - The amazing and splendid gothic cathedral in Paris. Next see Palais Garnier - Great Opera House. Then enjoy a One Hour Cruise on the Seine. (Seine river cruise ride included). Next stop is Le Trocadero et son esplanade Trocadero is a palace built for the world's fair. The buildings now house a number of museums: the Musée national de la Marine (naval museum) and the Musée de l'Homme (ethnology) in the southern (Passy) wing. the Cité de l'Architecture et du Patrimoine, including the Musée national des Monuments Français, in the eastern (Paris) wing, from which one also enters the Théâtre national de Chaillot, a theatre below the esplanade. (Admission for Museums not included). Next stop will be Conciergerie - It is an old prison where the last king Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette were held before the execution. (Admission not included). Your last stop is Pont des Arts - Bridge with love padlocks (Admission Ticket Included). There are many other stops you can visit on your hop on hop off tour. After spending time visiting different parts of the city, take a break from the busy streets and relax on a leisurely cruise along the Seine. With cruises running at all hours of the day, you can experience the cruise under the midday sun, catching the sites as the sun disappears over the horizon or wait until after dark to see the monuments twinkling against the night sky. Regardless of the hour, it is sure to be an experience to remember. Plus, the live commentary will divulge interesting facts about the history of the monuments that attract millions of tourists to Paris each year. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 13 / Paris

Breakfast at the Hotel. Day free to explore Paris Attractions on your own or wish to shop in the fashionable city. Alternatively you can visit Disneyland Paris for a day. (Contact our reservations team). Day is free as you wish. Overnight at the Hotel.

Day 14 / Paris

Breakfast at the Hotel. Check out of the hotel by 1100 hrs. Day free at leisure on your own until departure transfer to the airport/train station.
